Eligibility Requirements for Sophomore CTE PSEO

High school sophomores may enroll in one career or technical education (CTE) course at Ridgewater College for their first semester. Sophomores must have a reading score of 850 or higher on the 8th grade Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment (MCA); if a student has not taken the MCA, then they can take the ACCUPLACER Reading test and must earn a score of 220 or higher. There is no appeal process (per MDE) if a student does not meet the MCA score requirement, or if they do not meet the ACCUPLACER score requirement.
